A LIVING SIGN OF CHRIST ALIVE

Christ is risen! Hallelujah!

After a joyful celebration on April 20, the Easter season continues for the next several weeks up until the Day of Pentecost on June 8. We continue to share the good news that Christ is living and present with us now to set free, renew, and walk with us. Of course, this is news that we celebrate throughout the year. As a people of resurrection hope, we can expect and take notice of signs of the living Christ around us.

I was on vacation last week and worshipped with another congregation, but I was glad to hear of the way that seminary student Meagan McLaughlin commented in her sermon at Holy Trinity on one such sign of Christ's living presence. She reflected on our congregation's work around the issue of payday lending, an issue that came up through our community organizing efforts, as an example of resurrection life.

Holy Trinity's work began with those willing to share their painful experiences of financial and emotional desperation that led to seeking out one high-interest loan, then another, until they were caught in a seemingly endless web of loans that only become more difficult to repay. By finding a safe space to share their stories, they touched each other's wounds, and found the promise of resurrection. They came to see that they were not alone, and just that fact, this not-aloneness, brought hope and resurrection. It was not easy, revealing stories that held such pain and shame, but their courage and vulnerability has made possible a vision and hope for change. As they have shared their wounds, others in similar situations have learned that there is hope. Resurrection is possible. Anna, Sherri, and Renee had the courage to speak publically about their experiences, and through partnerships between the Joint Religious Legislative Coalition and other faith communities, change in laws around payday lending are being discussed at many levels, so that others will not be taken advantage of in this way. If fact, after two years of advocacy work, a bill placing restrictions on payday lending passed the MN House floor on Friday! Resurrection is possible. And with a grant from The Colonial Church of Edina and support from other community partners, Exodus Lending, a new low interest loan alternative envisioned by Holy Trinity members, will soon become a reality. Resurrection is possible, and because of those who have been willing to allow others to see their wounds, the risen Jesus who is always present has been able to work with and through them to bring resurrection not only to Holy Trinity, but to our community and state as well.

It is important that we celebrate the work we do together as a congregation. More than that, it is important that we recognize the presence of Christ who is at work through us. I am grateful for the way Meagan has helped to call our attention to this particular sign of resurrection.

We ourselves are a "living sign of Christ alive" as expressed in the hymn text by Susan Briehl commissioned for Holy Trinity's 100th anniversary. It is not only through our work but simply through our being who we are—unique individuals, blessed, called, and gathered into a worshipping community—that we give witness to the resurrected Christ. Thanks be to God!
