UPDATES FROM CHURCH COUNCIL

Recommendation from the Building Project Working Group

In response to what was heard during Holy Trinity's listening campaign, the Church Council appointed a building project working group consisting of Randy Nelson, Liz Blood, David Krig and Lynda Nordholm (chair), in addition to Pastor Jay Carlson and Pastor Ingrid Rasmussen. The working group was charged with identifying an architectural firm for the feasibility and design of remodeling, and to bring the name of the firm to the Church Council for recommendation to the congregation in 2015.

From a list of more than 35 Minnesota architectural firms that have experience with church buildings (provided by the ELCA's church building consultant), the working group identified about 20 to contact, including two firms the group self-identified. Following phone conversations with each firm, and taking a closer look at their composition and work experience, six firms were asked to participate in a walkthrough of the building with the working group. A Request for Proposal (RFP) was subsequently sent to each of those firms. After consideration of the proposals received, four firms were invited to interview with the working group. The interviews revealed two strong contenders, and after deliberation, the group came to a consensus on one firm: Miller Dunwiddie Architecture.

After discussion at its March meeting, the Council accepted the working group's recommendation to work with Miller Dunwiddie in order to design a building remodel project.

At this point, the Council would again like to turn to the congregation for input. On Sunday, March 29, the Adult Forum will be dedicated to coming together to learn about and discuss the work that the building project working group underwent and their recommendation. There will then be a congregational meeting on Sunday, April 12, after the 11:00 service for the purpose of approving this direction. Although a congregational vote is not required to hire the architect for initial design work, we want this process to be as encompassing of the whole congregation as possible. All voices and thoughts are valued and necessary in this process. During the meeting we will also discuss what the next steps of the process would be and how we would provide opportunities for congregation members to offer input for the architect's design. We would hope to have a design ready for congregational approval by fall.

Partner Parish Opportunity in El Salvador

The Council received a recommendation from the Peace with Justice Committee through its partner parish working group to seek a partner parish relationship with a congregation in El Salvador. The next step will be to write to the bishop of the Salvadoran Lutheran Church asking whether there are congregations who would like to consider a partnership with us. Then we would send a delegation next winter to meet possible partners and to develop a recommendation about our partnership for consideration and action by the Church Council.

Bylaw Revisions

At a congregational meeting on Sunday, March 22, members approved the proposed bylaw revisions. These changes generally reflect how work is currently being carried out by our various committees and also serve to make the language of the bylaws consistent with the rest of the Constitution.

PALM SUNDAY

The first and second readings and psalm are the same this Sunday ever year: Christ emptying himself of divine power and protection, willingly becoming vulnerable to those who struck him and put him to death. With Christ we lament his suffering and all human suffering, but expect God's final vindication. In Mark's Gospel, Jesus is welcomed into Jerusalem with palm branches and shouts of Hosanna!
