AN UPDATE ON EXODUS LENDING

For nearly four years, Holy Trinity has been leading the development of Exodus Lending, a payday loan refinancing option for borrowers in financial crisis. On April 2, Exodus Lending opened for business. Standing outside of the payday lending storefront on Lake & Minnehaha, we invited our neighbors to bring their payday debt to us – we'd buy their loans from their lenders and refinance them at no interest. They could then pay their loans back to us with dignity, supported by volunteer coaches, LSS financial counselors and incentivized savings.

Since that April launch date, Exodus Lending has refinanced \$4,800 of payday loan debt for seven clients. Without this refinancing, those seven borrowers were on track to pay more than \$19,000 in fees and interest over the next 12 months. This past Friday was the first payment due date for Exodus' earliest borrowers, and I'm pleased and proud to share that all payments came in on time and in full! Borrowers have connected with both their volunteer coaches and with LSS financial counselors and report that they're excited to have these meetings and excited to have a plan and to feel hopeful about their financial future.

Exodus Lending is also excited to share they have been awarded the 2015 Financial Advocacy Award from Lutheran Social Service of Minnesota. It's been a big month and Exodus Lending's leadership wants to thank you for your ongoing prayers and support.
