# ANNUAL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

With approximately 140 Holy Trinity members in attendance, we gathered in the church gym for a delightful annual meeting on Sunday afternoon. I want to offer my thanks to Sara Jensen and the rest of the Church Council for their leadership as well as to all who gave reports, asked questions, prepared the meal, and otherwise helped to make it a fun day of giving thanks for our life and ministry together. Minutes of the meeting will be available soon, but I'm happy to share some highlights:

- Four new members were elected to three-year terms on the Church Council: Judy Davison, Chris Engen, David Krig, and Roberta Shaw. I'm grateful for their gifts and willingness to serve in leadership for the congregation. Thanks also to the Nominating Committee for their hard work. When the Council meets in February, we will decide whether to add any one-year appointments to Council.
- Following the congregational meeting, the new Council met to elect officers. Sara Jensen and Laura Bolstad were reelected as president and treasurer. Theresa Rian will step into the vice president role, and our new secretary is Melanie Townsend.
- Our financial position is strong, as offerings and other income covered all of our expenses last year. We had planned to use \$35,000 from a special estate fund in 2015 but ended up only needing to use \$20,000.
- Our average worship attendance in 2015 was 216, which is up from the previous year's average of 198. I believe this reflects the number of new people visiting and joining Holy Trinity as well as regular participation by the congregation, both of which are signs of a healthy congregation. Your weekly worship means a lot to our community of faith.
- The congregation approved a budget of \$750,500 for 2016. This is an increase of about \$23,000 over last year's budget, but the Council and Financial Stewardship Committee are confident that we can meet this new goal together. Thank you for your generous giving!
- We approved two special appeals for 2016: ELCA World Hunger and Refugee Resettlement (through Lutheran Social Service and MN Council of Churches). Watch for more information about each and an opportunity to help out with sponsoring a refugee family this spring.
- I am pleased that the Personnel Committee has worked hard over the last several years to bring staff salaries in line with synod guidelines. We have an exceptionally talented and dedicated team with whom I feel privileged to work on a daily basis, and I believe it's important to the whole congregation that we show each staff member that they are valued. A question was raised during the meeting on Sunday about the possibility of continuing to raise salaries beyond the minimum guideline. There was good discussion about the issue, and we recognized that there are a variety of factors to take into account before adjusting the personnel budget. The congregation then approved a motion to "encourage the Personnel Committee to have conversations about how to adjust/improve the pastors' and staff's salaries." As this conversation moves forward, I want to express that I personally feel well supported and compensated by the congregation. This suggestion did not come from a staff member but was made with appreciation for the work of our staff. I think I can speak on behalf of the church staff in saying that such expressions of appreciation mean a great deal to us. (continued in next column)

Throughout the meeting, members reported on our efforts relative to our five current congregational goals:

- 1. Nurture faith, life, and relationships in worship experiences, small groups, and meaningful volunteer opportunities.
- 2. Grow in children, youth, and family ministry.
- 3. Grow in intercultural competence and understanding.
- 4. Advocate for alternative energy sources and payday lending regulations.
- 5. Launch a capital campaign for building renovation.

The funding team reported that we have so far received \$630,000 in pledges for the "Opening Doors" building campaign. We still have a ways to go with the campaign in reaching our goal of \$850,000 and our goal of 100% participation.
