WALKING TOGETHER

Several months ago, I got a call from Arif Mamdani, a chaplain intern at the Volunteers of America Residential Reentry Center on Lake Street. Arif was organizing a spiritual practices group for the men living at the RRC, a facility commonly called "a halfway house." He had heard from a mutual friend of ours that Holy Trinity had a labyrinth and was willing to share it with the community. "Could we come to Holy Trinity and use it on Good Friday?" he asked. I replied (on behalf of all of us), saying, "Yes!"

The men came before the service on Good Friday and left before we were done worshiping in the Bartsch Room. Among them were individuals who have been incarcerated with the MN Department of Corrections and Federal Bureau of Prisons. On average, they serve the final portions of their sentences—usually 4-6 months—at the 50+ bed facility housed in the former Hauge McDivitt Funeral Home building, which became RRC in the mid-1970s. In addition to providing accountability, there are a variety of programming opportunities for the residents (e.g., employment, housing, cognitive behavioral, mental health, chemical dependency, prosocial activities).

The labyrinth walkers were very moved by their Good Friday experience. Arif wrote, saying, "There are no words for how grateful and welcomed we all felt at your generosity and hospitality this evening. There was a palpable sense of the holy when we entered the gym and saw the space that you had created for us. From the music to the candles, I could tell the guys were moved, and our time there only served to reinforce that feeling. Our walking time was really moving for all of the guys. Several said that they felt a sense of the Holy Spirit moving through them as they walked, and there was a moment when they were all standing together in the center of the labyrinth, facing each other, that I was very aware of God's presence in the space with us...As I'm sure you know, the guys from VOA are not often welcomed into many places never mind as warmly and personally as you did."

It went so well that, even though most of them were new to the practices of labyrinths, many of the participants expressed interest in returning to Holy Trinity to walk again! Since Good Friday, Theresa Rian, Holy Trinity Council member, has been in conversation with Arif and the VOA staff. This summer, we are going to engage in an experiment. Starting on Tuesday, June 14 from 7-8 p.m., the labyrinth will be open once each month for VOA residents and Holy Trinity members to walk together. We will limit the number of Holy Trinity participants to ten, at least in the beginning, to ensure this opportunity has a feeling of mutuality between the two communities.
