## WELCOME, LVC VOLUNTEERS

It's only one year, but I have heard from several Holy Trinity members that their participation in Lutheran Volunteer Corps (LVC) changed their lives for good. For one year, volunteers commit to living in intentional community, practicing a simple and sustainable lifestyle, and working for peace with justice. They engage in conversations about racism, oppression, and privilege and how these contribute to ongoing injustice in our society. They also explore the role that spirituality plays in inspiring and sustaining work in the quest for peace with justice. The year goes by quickly, but the learning and commitments remain with them for a lifetime.

Minneapolis is one of 13 cities in the United States where LVC operates and seeks to unite people to work for peace with justice. They place volunteers in full-time positions at social justice organizations for one year and provide opportunities for them to live and learn together. Volunteers receive a modest stipend which covers housing, food, transportation, health insurance, and personal expenses.

Holy Trinity serves as the sponsoring congregation for the LVC Wellstone House, located in the Powderhorn Park neighborhood. Six new volunteers just moved into the house, and it was a pleasure to welcome them in our worship service on Sunday.

**Isabella Alsobrook** is from Los Angeles and will be serving at Lutheran Social Service Refugee Services. Isabella is most excited to form relationships with refugee clients being resettled in Minneapolis. She also hopes to forge lifelong friendships with her housemates.

**Maryl Fennie** is from La Crosse, Wisconsin and will be serving at Immigrant Law Center of Minnesota, an agency that provides legal assistance to low-income immigrants and refugees in Minnesota. Maryl is most excited about working for justice and learning about Minneapolis.

**Chase McAdams** is from Santa Barbara, California and will be serving at Restorative Justice Community Action, an organization that focuses on the needs of the victims, the wrongdoers, and the involved community to identify solutions that promote repair, reconciliation, and relationships. Chase is most excited about being able to contribute full-time to a social justice non-profit without taking up as much of their resources.

**Kasi Misseldine** is from Decorah, Iowa and will be serving as the Outreach Coordinator at Trinity Lutheran Congregation in the Cedar-Riverside neighborhood of Minneapolis. Trinity says that after 140 years, they are really good at change. They seek to embrace radical hospitality in a multicultural faith community. Kasi is most excited about building community and navigating Minneapolis by bike.

**Connor Phelan** is from a suburb of Chicago and will be serving at Minneapolis Bicycle Coalition, an organization that inspires people to bicycle and advocates for a city where everyone feels comfortable riding. Connor is most excited to explore Minneapolis by bike.

**Laura Proescholdt** is from Cumberland, Wisconsin and will be serving at Minnesota Housing Partnership, which convenes, guides, and supports a diversity of partners working to improve conditions of home and community, especially for people at the lowest income levels. Laura is most excited about living in community and soaking up as much as she can from Powderhorn and greater Minneapolis.

I'm grateful for the opportunity to continue our partnership with LVC and with these six volunteers. If you would like to be part of the LVC support team that walks with these volunteers throughout the year and feeds them on occasion, talk to me or Pastor Ingrid. Watching them live out their spiritual commitments through LVC can be inspiring for all of us.
