## PASTORAL TRANSITION TIMELINE

### January 4, 2017

Pastor Jay, Pastor Ingrid, the Executive Committee (Sara Jensen, Theresa Rian, Laura Bolstad, Melanie Townsend, Pastor Jay, and Pastor Ingrid), and the Personnel Committee (Deb Sodt, Sara Jensen, Carol Berg, Liz Conway, and Phil Jury) met with Rev. John Hulden, Assistant to the Bishop for the Minneapolis Area Synod to discuss next steps. These steps are outlined below.

### January 4-17, 2017

The Executive Committee was tasked with the creation of a Transition Team. At Rev. John Hulden's suggestion, the Transition Team will be comprised of one 2017 Council member and five members of the congregation. After receiving nominations from the pastors, Executive Committee, and Personnel Committee, the Executive Committee recommended that Cathy Alpizar, Josh Becker, Tom Kleven, Theresa Rian (Council Member), Sara Jensen, and Deb Sodt serve as the Transition Team members. The Council approved this slate of candidates at its January meeting, and candidates were approached soon thereafter.

The Transition Team's primary task is the creation of the Ministry Site Profile (MSP), a document intended for use by congregations and church-related organizations that are seeking to call an ordained or lay rostered minister of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America or a First Call candidate for rostered ministry. The Ministry Site Profile offers a snapshot of the congregation's life, hopes, and needs.

### January 18-29, 2017

Before we call Holy Trinity's next Lead Pastor, we will be served by an Interim Lead Pastor for approximately 9-18 months. This person is trained to assist congregations in transition and to prepare congregations for the calling of a pastor. At the suggestion of Rev. John Hulden, the Council has tasked the Personnel Committee and Pastor Ingrid with interviewing 2-3 candidates for the position of Interim Lead Pastor. Candidate names will be provided by the synod office and will remain confidential. We expect to announce the Interim Lead Pastor by early March, if not before. The Interim Lead Pastor's start date will depend on her or his current work obligations and availability.

### DAY ON THE HILL THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 23

JRLC's Day on the Hill is the Joint Religious Legislative Coalition's annual policy briefing and lobby day. Participants are briefed on the JRLC issues that are being debated and voted on at our State Capitol. Clergy and lay people from across the state attend Day on the Hill to show an interfaith commitment to social justice and to participate in the lawmaking process. The event includes a meal, inspiration, issue briefings, and opportunities to take action. Registration is required. Talk with Meghan Olsen Biebighauser for more information.
