#### JANUARY 15 "Healing the Land, Healing Ourselves" Mike Larsen and Linda Nelson

Since 2004, Mike Larsen and Linda Nelson have worked to heal their 62 acres overlooking Whitewater State Park. As they struggle to regenerate the former glory of prairie and oak savanna, they view themselves as community builders. They invite you to not only hear (and see in pictures!) their story of healing and love, but to join them in their community-building as well.

#### JANUARY 22 "Organic and Conventional Farming" David Legvold

David Legvold is a retired educator who operates an 800-acre farm. While not an organic farmer, David employs and advocates practices that further soil and water conservation. For several years, Ben, his organic CSA neighbor, and Dave have attracted crowds at the Minnesota State Fair with their presentation, "Organic and Conventional Farming: the Real Dirt," which includes valuable information about organic and conventional farming practices that preserve and enhance the environment. Dave was named a Minnesota Water Hero by Governor Mark Dayton in the spring of 2016. He also opens up his farm to Carleton and St. Olaf students to research the effects of faith-based restorative agriculture. Whether you are a backyard gardener, have agricultural roots, or care about environment, you will benefit from this presentation.
