MOSAICS ON DISPLAY AT HOLY TRINITY

In 2019, the Minneapolis Area Synod Assembly commissioned three beautiful mosaic panels from the Semilla Center for Healing and the Arts at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in south Minneapolis and they are currently lending the panels out to their member churches. Holy Trinity was able to get on the lending list for August, just in time for our sanctuary reopening! We hope you'll take a minute to enjoy these beautiful mosaics if you're able to get into the sanctuary in August. The artists' statement is below.

These three panels were created by the Semilla Center for Healing and the Arts. "Semilla" means "seed" in Spanish, and the center works to plant seeds of hope by teaching and creating public art that can help make the community healthier, safer, and more beautiful.

The panel "Feed the World" is our call to end world hunger. The images reflect the Three Sisters that native peoples planted together: corn, beans, and squash. It is a planting that naturally calls to cooperation. As in nature, we are all one; we are all in this world together.

The panel "Love the Earth" shows native flowers of Minnesota, which attract pollinators needed for life: butterflies, bees, and hummingbirds. Under the earth, you can see a different kind of pollinator: bugs and animals that help create the soil that nourishes all of us.

The middle panel was done by attendees of the assembly, under the direction of Pastor Luisa Cabello Hansel, Artistic Director of Semilla and co-pastor at St. Paul's. AUGUST 8 "Caring for Creation" Barbara Rossing, Professor at Luther Seminary

The Rev. Dr. Barbara R. Rossing is professor of New Testament at the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago, where she has taught since 1994. She loves to teach and preach about the Bible, including the Bible's role in public life.

An avid environmentalist, Rossing is involved with environmental initiatives at the seminary. Rossing received the bachelor of arts degree from Carleton College, the master of divinity degree from Yale University Divinity School and the doctor of theology degree from Harvard University.

AUGUST 15 "Rebuilding with Dignity and Respect" Pastor Doug Mork

Pastor Doug Mork and a member of the CTUL construction organizing team will present an update on the campaign to build a Worker-driven Social Responsibility (WSR) model for non-union construction in the Twin Cities. They will talk about the growing problems of wage theft, misclassification, safety violations and even labor trafficking in construction and the creative solutions being pursued by workers in Minneapolis, both through CTUL and the Building Dignity and Respect Standards Council (BDC) and by other allies and partners.

NEW VIDEO HIGHLIGHTS HOLY TRINITY

Mission Investment Fund (MIF) assisted Holy Trinity with funding in 2016 when we undertook a remodel of the building's east entrance and office areas. They recently created a video profiling the church as one of their partners. As part of the video, they highlighted the roles Holy Trinity took on after George Floyd's murder and the subsequent unrest.

COVID-19 AND HOLY TRINITY

Holy Trinity recently revised some of our COVID-19 restrictions and resumed in-person worship in the sanctuary on August 1. This was possible because the COVID case (Column B) and test positivity (Column C) rates among Hennepin County residents had consistently improved over the summer. Unfortunately, those hopeful trends have reversed somewhat in recent weeks. The percentage of people living in Hennepin County who are fully vaccinated has gone up very little. The number of people diagnosed with COVID-19 and the percentage of laboratory tests that are positive have increased. Although all of these are still below our "caution threshold" ranges, we will continue to monitor the situation and keep abreast of public health recommendations for controlling the spread of the virus.
