BOUNDARY WATERS CAMPING ADVENTURE AUGUST 12-16

It may be cold outside now, but close your eyes and picture calm clear water under sunny blue skies. This year, our Boundary Waters camping adventure is scheduled for August 12-16. WHEN AM I SCHEDULED TO SERVE IN WORSHIP?

As of this Sunday we will place printed schedules in the Community Room of volunteers who are scheduled to serve in upcoming weeks.

As many of you know, we use a software called "Ministry Scheduler Pro" (MSP) to manage the scheduling of worship ministry volunteers. Anyone who signs on to serve is instructed how to set up an MSP user account on a smart phone or PC so they can go in and manage their own schedule. You can mark dates in the calendar when you are unavailable to serve or pick up shifts for another volunteer who has requested a swap after the scheduling has been done. It's very helpful if you watch the bulletin or newsletter for a notice that we are getting ready to auto-schedule for upcoming months. We typically schedule 2 months at a time. It helps a lot if you remove yourself from dates you cannot serve prior to the time we run auto. The May-June and the July-August MSP schedules are available; volunteers can go into MSP now and mark any dates you cannot serve.
