Holy Trinity member Josh Becker, MD, practices internal medicine in Edina and is a member of the Covid Task Force at Holy Trinity.

AUGUST 7

"The Boundary Waters in a Pandemic"

Holy Trinity member Kevin Proescholdt will share his insights on trekking in the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness (BWCAW) during COVID times.

Kevin guided canoe trips in Minnesota's million-acre BWCAW for 10 years and has visited designated and undesignated Wildernesses throughout the U.S. and Canada. He helped pass the 1978 BWCA Wilderness Act through Congress, directed the Friends of the Boundary Waters Wilderness for 16 years, and co-authored the 1995 book *Troubled Waters: The Fight for the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness*. Kevin has been active with Wilderness Watch since 1989, joined the board of directors in 2003, and served two years as president of the board. He has written extensively on the Boundary Waters, and wilderness policy and history.
