




TODAY "The Boundary Waters in a Pandemic" with Kevin Proescholdt

Holy Trinity member Kevin has guided canoe trips in Minnesota's million-acre Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness (BWCAW) for 10 years and visited designated and undesignated Wildernesses throughout the U.S. and Canada. He helped pass the 1978 BWCA Wilderness Act through Congress, directed the Friends of the Boundary Waters Wilderness for 16 years, and co-authored the 1995 book *Troubled Waters: The Fight for the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness*. Kevin has been active with Wilderness Watch since 1989, joined the board of directors in 2003, and served two years as president of the board.
