# STAINED GLASS LISTENING SESSION REPORT

On Tuesday this week, 22 Holy Trinity households gathered virtually for a listening session about Holy Trinity's stained-glass windows. Hosted by the Our Shared Home working group and facilitated by Rev. Jim Bear Jacobs (associate pastor at Church of All Nations and co-director for Racial Justice at the Minnesota Council of Churches), the listening session was another opportunity for members to share their thoughts about the windows in the sanctuary. This was part of the discussion (one that has been going on for at least a decade) to inform the group as we address the windows with an eye toward our commitment to racial justice.

Participants shared thoughtful and personal reflections about the windows, and their connections (or lack of connections) to them. We learned that the window behind the altar was replaced in the 1970s at the direction of the pastor. We were asked to consider:

- What stories the windows tell?
- What is the difference between a sanctuary, a classroom, and a public space?

People touched on artistic integrity, spiritual meaning, history, the role of Holy Trinity as a church for the community as well as for its membership, and future generations. Many were in agreement that this issue is multi-faceted and not simply either/or. If you'd like to view the hour-long zoom recording, click <a href="here">here</a>.

# WEAVING PROJECT-INVITING YOU TO BRING OBJECTS OF DELIGHT THROUGH OCTOBER 9

A drawing by a young person in your life, a colorful post-card, a train ticket, the rules to your favorite board game, a colorful pair of earrings... During these weeks, we invite you to bring an object that inspires delight. A worry stone, a piece of clothing from your youth, song lyrics, a prayer, a paintbrush, the recipe for your favorite soup... Between now and October 9, we invite you to bring an object that brings you delight!

- $\circ$  Bring your objects to the box in the Sanctuary/ Community room.
- We'll weave your objects into the community tapestries; your objects will not be returned to you. If there's a cherished item you want included, consider a photo, scan, drawing, or another creative representation!


#### PROPERTY WORK DAY THURSDAY, OCTOBER 27
