THE MAGIC OF DÍA DE REYES

I have fond memories of the magic of *el Día de los Reyes Magos* (the Day of the Magi Kings) or simply *Día de Reyes* which is what we call the Feast of the Epiphany in the Spanish-speaking world. On the evening before the feast day, we would polish our shoes, set out hay and water for the camels, and write our wish lists to the Three Wise Men. The next day, we would wake up excited to find the gifts placed beside our shoes and the hay nibbled away as the Magi made their way to gift gold, frankincense, and myrrh to the Christ Child.



My family would then gather for a feast of hot chocolate and King's Cake or *Rosca de Reyes* as we celebrated the day. Baked within the bread were baby Jesus figurines, and anyone who found one was responsible for providing treats on Candlemas (also known as the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Candlemas is always 40 days after Christmas).

As I look back on these traditions now, I recognize how thoroughly we were colonized by Spain, how important the western Christian liturgical calendar has been in shaping Hispanic culture, and how magical the story of Jesus can be.

Happy Birthday to Holy Trinity's Solar System!

Mid December brought back good memories of our solar system being switched on at that time last year. Thru Dec. 17, our system generated about 42% of our electricity. Our total electrical bill for 2022 is \$5,500 less than our last pre-COVID year, but we have used a lot less electricity due to the broken air conditioner, and a complete conversion to LED bulbs. We are continuing to monitor billing issues with Xcel Energy. We receive a credit for the amount of energy our system produces between 1:00 and 7:00 p.m. each day, Xcel's peak energy draw time. That credit was \$1,200 (included in the savings mentioned above) and this should continue for the life of the system. Xcel did increase their rates this year about 8%, but the good thing about using solar is that rate increases don't apply to the electricity we receive from our solar system; the price stays fixed at what we paid for it.

Windsorce Energy Continues to be a Good Deal!

Our church and 117 members subscribed to Xcel's renewable *Windsorce* energy program in 2017. Xcel charges a premium for this program, but the utility's surcharge is part of a clean energy future and continues to drop over time. *Windsorce* subscribers: check out your electric bill for the past seven months; Xcel is charging less for wind energy than traditional fuel (gas, coal, nuclear). If you have not yet subscribed, call Xcel and enroll in the *Windsorce* program at no charge to you. Your payments will go towards building the next wind turbine. Holy Trinity still is 100% enrolled in *Windsorce* even though we now have solar and we've seen our annual net wind surcharge drop from \$1,000 to \$100 over the past four years.

HTLC CIVIL RIGHTS MOVEMENT SPRING TRIP

Montgomery, Alabama, has a checkered history as arguably the center of the slave trade when slavery reigned in the south, and as the birthplace of the Civil Rights Movement of the 20th century when the courage of Rosa Parks kicked off a Movement in the 1950s that led to major civil rights legislation in the 1960s. Both aspects of this history are there to be experienced as the focus of a Civil Rights Movement trip that will be available to members of Holy Trinity in the spring of 2023.

Under the leadership of Joanne Sorenson, a retired Lutheran pastor and founder of the non-profit organization "In Our Hands," the reality of that part of our history can be experienced with a week-long trip that will be centered in Montgomery, Selma, and Birmingham, Alabama, with the likelihood that either Atlanta, Georgia, or Memphis, Tennessee, will be an additional stop. Joy and Randy Nelson participated in a shorter version of the trip in October and found it to be a sobering and deeply moving experience.

The dates will be Monday, April 17, through Sunday, April 23, 2023. Cost is likely to be \$2,000 per person with transportation, lodging, program fees, and some meals included. There will be room for up to 18 participants. *Commitments will be needed by March 1, 2023*, and more information will be shared as details are finalized.

PASTOR ANGELA ON LEAVE


