## ANNUAL MEETING RECAP

After a combined 10 AM worship service, the 119<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting of Holy Trinity convened last week in the gym. It was the first hybrid annual meeting, with a full basement and a full zoom screen of members who joined us online. Thanks to everyone who helped with preparation, setup, lunch, childcare and all the other roles that made this gathering a success.

In addition to conducting the regular financial business of the congregation, highlights of the meeting include:

- Acknowledge of communal grief over Pastor Angela's departure and space for sharing, questions and conversation.
- Small group discussions around Holy Trinity's five congregational goals for next year:
  - Nurture community care and connection as we emerge from COVID separation and isolation.
  - Grow in competency and commitment to racial justice, particularly naming and actively addressing anti-Blackness.
  - Deepen commitment to issues of gender and sexuality, particularly people who identify as Transgender.
  - Continue to grow in competency and commitment to caring for God's creation.
  - Honor the Dakota people, the original and contemporary stewards of this land.
- Election of 4 new members of the Council (Anne Beschnett, Matt Floding, Sandra Hisakuni, and Dennis O'Brien) and announcement of the 2023 Executive Committee: Allison Johnson Heist, Council President; Gretchen Lund, Vice President; Erin Henry, Secretary; and Katie Schroeder, Treasurer. We are so blessed with leaders of vision and integrity!
- Recommendations from the Stepping Out Home working group that will guide the council and congregation on updates to the building that will serve mission and ministry.
- An extraordinary video from the Stepping Out in Faith Community working group: <https://vimeo.com/795392792>
- Approval of the 2023 budget and authorization of 2023 special appeals for ELCA World Hunger, the Lutheran Diaconal Association and MIGIZI.
- Approval of a new land acknowledgement for use by Holy Trinity—watch for more from the Council on how this will be lifted up in the life of the congregation.

## SOUTH MINNEAPOLIS MEALS ON WHEELS IS 50!

Fifty years ago this month (January 15, 1973) marks the first delivery of meals by South Minneapolis Meals on Wheels (SMMOW)! Then-Nokomis-Heights-Lutheran, and Holy Name Catholic Church members answered the request of the Greater Minneapolis Council of Churches to address the need for delivered meals to elderly and disabled residents. Their efforts, along with MANY volunteer hours, donations, and Board service by Holy Trinity and other area churches over the past 50 years has led to an organization that is still going strong today. Fun Fact–The original meals were delivered on REAL dinner plates with plastic domes to keep the food hot and were transported in heavy, wooden boxes with room for six meals. The plates/domes were picked up the next day and were not necessarily clean! We've lightened that load considerably, but are still a great option for those in need!
