AGATE SHELTER AND AFFORDABLE HOUSING UNITS

The shelter will serve about 54 single adults and there will be 48 units of flexible housing. All housing will be supported by on-site case management and other services.

REMINDER: WINTER PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Winter Parking Restrictions are still in effect, parking is banned on the EVEN numbered side (Holy Trinity side) of non-Snow-Emergency routes until April 1, unless conditions allow the City to lift the ban earlier. Parking is allowed on Snow Emergency routes, parkways, and the ODD numbered side of non-Snow Emergency routes, unless otherwise posted. Drivers parking in Minneapolis must follow these Winter Parking Restrictions, or they could be ticketed and towed.
