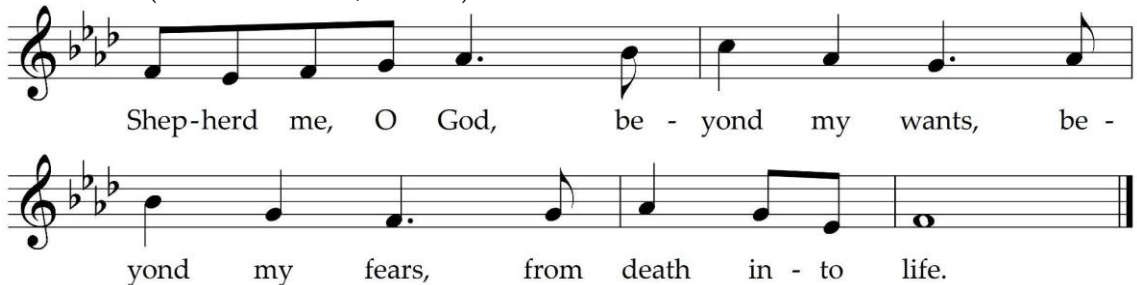

## **THANKSGIVING FOR BAPTISM**

Joined to Christ in the waters of baptism, we gather together clothed with God's mercy and forgiveness. Let us give thanks for the gift of baptism.

We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight. It's all yours—the earth and the sky, the fruit trees, the sun and the moon, the wild animals, and everything that creeps upon the ground.



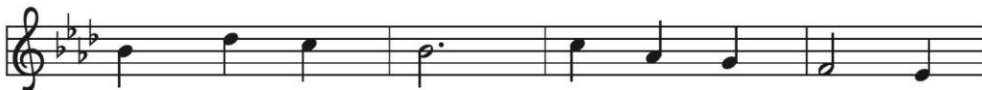

## HANDBELL RESTORATION SPECIAL APPEAL

In the 1960s, Holy Trinity purchased the first few octaves of our handbell set from the Whitechapel Bell Foundry in England. These handbells are unique, in that each bell contains more metal in the casting, producing a more full and rich sound. The quality of the casting and internal mechanisms contribute to their exceptional sound.

The unique nature of these instruments means there are very few options for who can perform maintenance on them within the United States. It has been many years since we've had full maintenance completed for our handbells, and the wear and tear has been showing.

This full restoration is estimated to cost \$7,000. The high cost of this restoration accounts for new handles which last anywhere from 10 years without handle stiffeners or 35+ years with handle stiffeners. This restoration will bring the bells back to original condition.
