
The Lord be with you. And also with you.



#### UPDATE ON CALL PROCESS FOR DEACON DAVID

On May 7, the congregation voted to organize a call committee to discern a call for an Associate Pastor at Holy Trinity. We resoundingly voted "yes" to move this process forward. A committee of dedicated members planned and conducted an interview in June and provided a recommendation to the council that we call Deacon David. The church council plans to call a congregational meeting in September to vote to call Deacon David, which is the last step in this process. If the congregation votes to extend a call to David, an ordination service would follow in the fall.

The astronomy exhibit on display in the Community Room and the Library is the product of Bob Ochtrup, a resident of Becketwood Senior Cooperative. It combines his love of astronomy and photography. The display is the result of Bob's research of NASA computer links and taking screen shots of celestial images.

The exhibit provides diverse images across the spectrum of stellar objects, from planets and our moon to galaxies, star clusters, nebula, nova, supernova, and even a visiting comet.
