### LOTS HAPPENING THIS SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 10— RENEWAL SUNDAY, BLESSING OF BACKPACKS, BIBLE DISTRIBUTION, HEALING STATION, CONGREGATIONAL MEETING, SUNDAY SCHOOL OPEN HOUSE AND CONFIRMATION WELCOME, AND MUSIC IN THE GARDEN

Students of all ages are invited and encouraged to bring their backpacks and briefcases to worship at 8:45 and 11:00 a.m. for a special moment set aside to ask God's blessings on all who have returned or will be returning to school or further education this fall. #### **MIGIZI FLAME TO BE EXTIGUISED**

This is the day we have eagerly awaited! Mike Miller heard from Kelly Drummer that she agrees the flame should be returned and extinguished at MIGIZI's Grand Opening on October 5th!

It has been a longer journey than we could have anticipated when Pr Ingrid compassionately said yes to the request to keep the flame. I did a bit of rough calculation of our journey: well over 400 candles have burned in 12 homes for more than 40 months by the time the flame will be returned. The flame has been at the heart of our homes in these months. Many of us have retold the story to our friends and neighbors as they saw the candle burning in our homes. And many of us have centered the flame as part of our meals, prayers, devotions. It has been a unique time for accompanying our native friends, for deeper learning of Indian history, and for understanding the challenges for communities of color to rebuild. It is a story of new life arising out of death. We say his name, George Floyd.

I am grateful, as I know you all are, to have been part of this holy journey. And as at any journey's end, I am relieved that we have kept the flame alive so that it may now come full circle to the remarkable new MIGIZI community home - whew!
