THE HANDBELLS HAVE RETURNED

The handbells at Holy Trinity have received a lot of love over the 60 years they've been with this congregation. They were purchased from the Whitechapel bell foundry in London in the early 1960's and have been ringing ever since. Over time, the bells began to show their age as several handles were falling apart and numerous internal mechanisms no longer functioned. The resulting instrument was difficult to play and incredibly inconsistent in tone quality. This year, we are fortunate to have them shining a little brighter and once again restored to full working condition.

The bells were carefully restored by Greg Cowan in his home workshop in Colorado Springs, CO. Greg's father spent his life ringing and restoring all sorts of unique handbells. Having spent his career restoring specialty cars, Greg was the only one of his siblings with the mechanical skills to take over his father's business. His lifetime of craftsmanship sure shows!

Greg worked wonders on the bells, custom making parts to restore functions to near-new perfection. His work was astounding and moving. During their vacation to Colorado, each bell was disassembled and polished, new felt pads were installed on the clappers, springs were replaced, several worn out handles were replaced with beautiful new ones, and every bell handle received a stiffener to help them hold up nearly 25 years! Noticing that some of the clappers in the bass bells wobbled slightly while ringing, Greg custom built new clapper mechanisms which made the bells function like new again.





I was fortunate enough to travel to Colorado Springs to meet Greg and make the return trip with the bells. At his shop, I felt like a kid on Christmas morning as I opened up each case of glimmering bells. Through his skillful labor, he had given new life to a tired, well-loved set of bells, restoring them far beyond my expectations. In a time of reawakening and reckoning after several tumultuous years, I find hope that, like our bells, our world might experience a season of renewal beyond expectation. It is my hope that like Greg, we might use our gifts in unexpected ways to become stewards

Leslie Metzen, Judge of District Court of the Ninth Judicial District, ends with "This court also notes that in other counties across norther Minnesota many of these cases involving pipeline protestors were dismissed outright or continued for dismissal with a small fine and an admonition to not commit a same or similar offense. In the interest of justice the charges against these three individuals who were exercising their rights to free speech and to freely express their spiritual beliefs should be dismissed. To criminalize their behavior would be the crime." It's heartfelt and shows that change happens.
