2023 SPECIAL APPEALS

Dear members,

We are grateful that so many of you give generously to the mission of this congregation and invite you to support one or more of our 2023 special appeals. Each year we extend our abundance in multiple ways, focusing on issues and opportunities that are approved at the congregation's annual meeting.

During the first half of the year, we asked for your support for the handbell repairs at Holy Trinity and the Boundary Waters canoe trips for the Indigenous youth of MIGIZI, our partner organization. We are so pleased to report that we received \$8,813 to complete the handbell project and \$13,110 to send 22 youth into the northern Minnesota wilderness. Thank you!

This fall we highlight our other two 2023 special appeals—namely, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America's World Hunger program and the Lutheran Diaconal Association, which supported the education of Deacon David Larson-Martínez. We invite you to make contributions to these two important organizations.

WORLD HUNGER

World hunger is widespread and all too evident in local communities in this country and globally. The ELCA World Hunger program attends to both, providing support to projects in 34 states and territories and 63 countries, including the United States. Last year it distributed 23 million dollars in direct food aid and through projects intended to address root causes of hunger. The data on hunger are deeply disturbing, with 11% of the world's population unable to access the food, they need to live active, healthy lives. Each year Holy Trinity identifies ELCA World Hunger as one of its special appeals because the problem of hunger is so pervasive and persistent, ever more so as migration exacerbates poverty and desperation. Once again, we are drawing your attention to this need, noting that all contributions, small or large, help.

LUTHERAN DIACONAL ASSOCIATION (DCA)

The Lutheran Diaconal Association (LDA) trains people of all Lutheran traditions for a life of service, prayer, and community. Their call and dedication leads them to work in diverse organizations alongside those in need, whether spiritual or material, and to bring the gospel to life. We see an example in our own Deacon David, who became a consecrated

SPIRITUAL DIRECTION AND COMPANIONSHIP GROUP WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 8

Spiritual Direction and Companionship is a long-standing practice and discipline. It is a helpful process for paying attention to our relationships—with self, with others, and with the Divine. A portion of Scripture is used—not as study—rather for mediation and contemplative prayer. This process can be regarded as praying with God's Word and paying attention to God's Presence in our lives.

In the small group one is encouraged to share one's own process with others. We are free to share but not required. All that is shared is confidential to the group. Holy Trinity will offer three separate and similar four week sessions with different dates and times for others to participate. After the initial sessions one may choose to continue but on a monthly (not weekly) basis.

The initial group will begin on Wednesday, November 8, 9:00 a.m. in the Mary Martha Room. There will be a sign-up sheet in the Community Room. NOMINATE A SPECIAL APPEAL FOR 2024

Each year, Holy Trinity identifies and authorizes special financial appeals for 2-3 organizations. Special appeals are characterized by being open ended (i.e., we give to the organization(s) what we receive), they are normally approved for just one year, and they are supported by a special appeal letter which is sent to all the giving households in the congregation.

The Financial Stewardship Committee and Church Council work together to select the organizations. They evaluate proposed organizations based on the organization's relationship to or history with Holy Trinity; the connection between the organization and the goals of Holy Trinity; and the donation's impact. They seek to achieve a balance between local and global giving.

If you have a 501(c)3 organization that you'd like to nominate, please contact one of the church's standing committees and ask for support of your nomination. By tradition, the World Hunger of the ELCA has been included as one of the causes designated for a special appeal and therefore does not need to be submitted by a standing committee. Nominations will be accepted until December 1, 2023. The congregation will be informed of the 2024 special appeals at our annual meeting in January.

Nominations, supported by a standing committee, may be emailed to Pastor Ingrid.
