CEASEFIRE CAROLING

Grateful for the extra red fleece scarf in the freezing temperatures, I sang amongst 30 other carolers as the concert let out of Orchestra Hall:

Free Palestine (x 4)
Now is the time (x 4)
We're here to take a stand
For the Holy Land
We have one demand:
Peace in the Land!
Everyone deserves a peaceful nation.
We can end illegal occupation.

While some concert goers avoided us, more than I anticipated smiled, some were moved to tears, some stopped to watch a full carol or two, others mouthed "thank you" in appreciation.

I, like many of you, feel my heart wrench daily with news from Palestine. Beyond calling my representatives to pressure a permanent ceasefire and no more funds to Israel, I often find myself scrolling and feeling sick or not scrolling at all and being avoidant. A Jewish coworker of mine has been reminding us that Palestinians are asking us to use our voices, to speak up and out. Singing in the Ceasefire Choir has been a hopeful, low-risk, grounding way for me to use my voice and disrupt "business as usual" in this Christmas season.

Teresa Butel invited Donna Goodlaxson and me to come to a rehearsal for the new Ceasefire Choir weeks ago, a group open to all but focusing on participation of white Christians, secular or practicing. The group is the answer to a call of, "We see our Muslim and Jewish community members showing up, but where are the Christians in this moment?"

The rehearsals and actions go beyond adapting classic Christmas carol lyrics to call for permanent Ceasefire. Leaders ground us in shared values and hold brief Teach-Ins about how we as Christians, and specifically white Christians, have benefitted and continue to benefit from Christian hegemony and settler colonialism, about Christian Zionism and its relationship to Jewish Zionism, and about Christian funding of Israel. It is clarifying to have terms defined. It is illuminating to get bits of history and how Christians connect to and benefit from this conflict. Donna has been a leader in the art build initiative of the group, preparing the visual aspect of the choir actions including making the signs and scarves. Teresa has been key in inviting many people to join and flyering during the choir actions. Their leadership and initiative, along with those organizing this Ceasefire Choir group, remind me that we can use our skills,

passions, and connections to make movements toward justice.
