

ON A THRESHOLD OF JUSTICE



Throughout the month of December and the season of Advent, Holy Trinity Lutheran Church has included you in "story preparation" based on your experiences at the church and in the Longfellow neighborhood of Minneapolis during the uprising in 2020 following George Floyd's murder. As part of this process, you were invited to write responses in a workbook that guides you through recollection and discernment about your experiences.

We now invite you to submit your workbook for use in our project, "On a Threshold of Justice: Stories of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church during the Uprising after George Floyd's Murder."

To submit your workbook, please follow this link. Completing the consent form and submitting your workbook should take about five minutes.

- If you completed your workbook electronically, you will be able to submit directly through this link.
- If you completed your workbook on paper, you will be provided directions with how to submit your workbook via the U.S. Postal Service. After you complete the form in the link, we will send pre-addressed stamped envelope to enable you to send your workbook to us from the mailing address you will provide. We will digitize the workbook and return it to you via the U.S. Postal Service within two weeks of receipt.

In addition, we are helping Holy Trinity collect stories for its historical archive. You may permit us to share a digital copy of your workbook with Holy Trinity, but doing so is not required for participation in our project.

If you are still working on your workbooks, you have plenty of time. Amy Levad, our partner in this project, will continue to collect workbooks on a rolling basis.
