INDIGENOUS JUSTICE COMMITTEE

Six years ago Pastor Ingrid asked us to form a task force to look at the effects of the Doctrine of Discovery, a little-known papal proclamation from 1493. The Doctrine provided the justification for European Christian nations to take indigenous lands and enslave the people of those lands. It justified taking slaves from Africa and acquiring the lands and people of the Western Hemisphere, Australia, New Zealand and other lands deemed to be "empty" (occupied by non-Christians). The Doctrine was enshrined in American law by the John Marshall court in 1823 and remains the basis of Indian Law in this country. From the arrival of Columbus in 1492 to 1900 the indigenous population of the Americas was reduced by 97%, making it the greatest holocaust in world history.

The task force decided to focus on the dual goals of education and advocacy. For education it has done forums, shown films, and disseminated historical and contemporary information on Indian tribes. In the fall of 2019 the Johnson Symposium featured Mark Charles, Dine/Navajo, as keynote speaker, a panel of Native representatives, and an honor ceremony with drum to recognize leaders. In 2023 the lead speaker was Winona LaDuke.

For advocacy, it has pursued a bill in the legislature that would create a fund for the Indians of Minnesota. Titled the Indian Recovery Act, it would place a small surtax on each real estate transaction. In aggregate it would raise 25 to 40 million dollars annually for Indian programs on the reservations and in urban areas.

The administration of the fund will be by the Indian Land Tenure Foundation, an organization with which we have a close relationship. In 2023 Holy Trinity donated \$250,000 to the Foundation which it used to create a "Beyond Land Acknowledgement Fund" for the purchase of land. That fund has since attracted additional donations and has now grown close to \$500,000.

In recent years the effort has been on creating a community of churches, organizations and individuals that will come together for the final effort to get the passage of the bill, now anticipated to be in the 2025 session of the Minnesota Legislature. The senate author of the bill is Senator Mary Kunesh, Standing Rock Descendant.

A great addition to the effort has been collaboration with the Repair Communities, an organization of urban and rural "repair communities" that decided to make passage of the Indian Recovery Act their top priority. Their other focus has been the support of the Makoce Ikikcupi ("land recovery" in Dakota) project near the Upper Sioux Community and Granite

TRUTH-TELLING & HEALING—INDIAN BOARDING SCHOOL

Most American Indian children were forced to attend boarding schools away from their tribes and families for a 150 year period during the 19th and 20th centuries. (There were at least 523 boarding schools in the U.S.—several were in Minnesota and surrounding states; at least 408 of them received some Federal financial support.) The purpose of these schools was to strip these children of their tribal cultures and force them to adopt the culture of the U.S. against their wills. This was a traumatic experience that haunts survivors and their families. Many children in these boarding schools suffered physical and emotional abuses by staff.

The ELCA began a project last year to increase our understanding of the true history of American Indian Boarding Schools and to tell the truth about them. The aim of this truth-telling is to promote healing among Native Americans and the larger American nation over the abuses and injustices against Indian children in those schools. The project is led by Vance Blackhawk of the Churchwide staff and Liz Andress from the Twin Cities. Dozens of members from across the ELCA have committed to research what happened in Indian Boarding Schools run or supported by Lutherans in order that the truth about them may be learned and told. I participate in this project, and Mike Miller of Holy Trinity's Indigenous Justice Task Force monitors its activities.

For inspiration, here is a recipe shared by Soup For You:

Brazilian Black Bean Soup

(6 servings)

Ingredients:

- 1 cup black beans, dry
- 6 cups water
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1/3 cup onion, chopped
- 1/3 cup carrots, chopped
- 4 cloves garlic, crushed
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 tablespoon cumin
- 2 stalks celery, chopped
- 1 teaspoon coriander
- 2 tablespoons red wine
- 1/3 cup orange juice, frozen concentrate (from a 16 oz. can)
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 1/3 teaspoon black pepper
- 1/8 teaspoon cayenne

Instructions:

The day before making soup, soak the beans in a large soup pot. On the day of serving, place the soaked beans in a pot, adding four times as much water as beans. Bring to a boil, cover, and simmer until tender (approximately 1 1/4 hrs).

Heat olive oil in a skillet. Add onion and half of the garlic. Add red wine. Sauté over medium heat until the carrots are just tender. Add remaining garlic, cumin, coriander, and the celery. Sauté until everything is very tender. Add the sautéed mixture to the beans, scraping in every last morsel.

Stir in the orange juice, lemon juice, black pepper, and cayenne. Simmer over very low heat. Serve topped with an artful arrangement of sour cream, cilantro, and salsa.
