## SYNOD ASSEMBLY MAY 2-4

We invite you to pray for the synod as we prepare for the election of the next bishop. The bishop election process is an opportunity for us to discern the needs of the synod and who God is calling as our next leader to guide us.

Who can serve as the bishop of the Minneapolis Area Synod? Candidates for bishop must be an ELCA minister of Word and Sacrament (as defined in section 8.11 of the Minneapolis Area Synod Constitution, which you can find here), though they need not be serving in the Minneapolis Area Synod. That person may serve up to two consecutive six-year terms. Nominees for bishop are required to sign a disclosure form authorizing a background check that will be conducted prior to the Synod Assembly.

Is there a job description for the Office of Bishop? Chapter 8 of the Minneapolis Area Synod Constitution outlines the qualifications, responsibilities, and term of office for the bishop. The Bishop serves as the synod's pastor and is called to administer sacraments, preach, provide pastoral care, ordain, install, advise and counsel, interpret and advocate, and serve as the synodical ecumenical officer. The Bishop also serves as the synod's chief executive and administrative officer, overseeing and administering the work of the synod; and supervising the leadership of other officers and staff.

The bishop will be elected by voting members of the Synod Assembly—lay members elected by the congregations of this synod together with all ordained pastors and deacons under call on the rosters of this synod, retired pastors elected in caucus to represent the retired pastors on the roster of this synod, the officers of the synod, and duly elected members of the Synod Council. The bishop will be elected at the next Synod Assembly, which is set for May 2-4, 2024, at Lord of Life Lutheran Church. Live results of the bishop election ballots will be posted here during the Synod Assembly, May 2-4.

Composer's Notes: this arrangement was created for us during Affirmation of Baptism (confirmation) at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church in Minneapolis, Minnesota, during my tenure there as a musician from 1996-2022. Each confirmand could choose in advance a particular stanza to be sung immediately following the laying on of hands as a sort of "theme verse" for this moment in their faith journey. The choosing of their stanza proved to be a meaningful part of their discussion with friends, parents, and faith leaders in the weeks leading up to their confirmation. The Youth Choir was responsible for singing the chosen stanza for their friends being confirmed, which added to the meaning of the moment not only for the confirmands, but for the entire congregation. Every time we rehearsed it and then sang "I Am a child of God" in worship I gave thanks to Cheryl and Bruce Harding for creating such a contemporary and grace-filled text that really seemed to give voice to the range of faith journeys represented in the lives of our young *people.* [...]
