For those worshiping at home, hear these words spoken for you: The body of Christ given for you. The blood of Christ shed for you.


These are the gifts of God for the people of God. **Thanks be to God.**

FEATURED MUSICIAN SPOTLIGHT

ANN SCHROOTEN, VOICE AND PIANO

I have been on the staff and a member of Holy Trinity since 1996. I grew up making music with my mom and five brothers at home and at church. There was never a family gathering that did not include some time around the piano. Growing up, I spent as much time outside as possible, learning to play football with my brothers, riding my bike everywhere, and running. Always running. To balance things out, my mom made sure that I took all the piano lessons that she never had herself (she taught herself to play by ear), and that I and my brothers would always be singing in the choir at school. Fortunately, I had a fantastic and patient piano teacher AND fabulous choral and band instructors all along the way.

I didn't consider myself much of a solo singer until my junior year in high school when a really musical guy in the senior class encouraged me to sing something at the spring talent show. He suggested that Carole King's "You've Got a Friend" would be a perfect fit, and that I could accompany myself. It went over so well that everyone said I should have been doing this all along! I was hooked.

Several years later, I went on to get my Bachelor degree in Vocal Music Performance at Saint Olaf College and a Masters in Choral Conducting at the U of MN. I sang professionally with VocalEssence for eight years and have conducted children's, youth, and adult choirs in community organizations, colleges, and churches for over 30 years. I absolutely LOVE making music with choirs of all ages, but my biggest thrill and most meaningful moments are those when a roomful of people lift their voices together. A roomful of people who do not necessarily consider themselves to be very good singers, let alone singers at all. The people at Holy Trinity might be very surprised to learn that there is at least one moment in worship each week when I stop singing along on a hymn because I am so moved by the collective singing of the congregation. Whenever this happens, I think of my mom, whose primary aim in life was to encourage people to lift up their voices together and join the music. Music was never her primary occupation, but it was the love of her life. I'd like to think that she would be quite proud of her daughter carrying on that love to the next generations.
