
Let us pray.

For those worshiping at home, hear these words spoken for you: The body of Christ given for you. The blood of Christ shed for you.


These are the gifts of God for the people of God. Thanks be to God. *All are welcome at the table. Grape juice and gluten-free wafers are available upon request to the server.*
