### HANDBELL HAPPENINGS AT HOLY TRINITY

LUTHERAN CHURCH

Handbells are an incredibly unique instrument for a number of reasons. One of my favorites is that handbells are the only instrument that takes over 20 hands to play. As a result, ringing teaches many lessons about interdependence and relying on one another as much as others rely on you. It is an absolute joy to see the bonds of community that this form of music making creates.

As the HTLC handbell director, I'm delighted to be carrying on the legacy of handbell ringing in this congregation which began over 60 years ago. I can't begin to imagine how many people have played these bells over the decades. While some have been added over the years, the original bells purchased from London in the early 1960's ring on at Holy Trinity today.

It's an exciting time to be a handbell ringer here at Holy Trinity! In addition to the Gloria Ringers ensemble which features adult ringers with varying levels of handbell experience, a new ensemble, the Jubilation Ringers, will be offered this year for youth in 6th to 12th grade. The Jubilation Ringers ensemble is seeking more members! If you know a young person who might be interested, please contact Logan Olson, Lolson@htlcmpls.org.

Holy Trinity will also host a new community handbell ensemble for LGBTQIA+ people and allies beginning this fall. Ring Out was founded with the mission of creating a more inclusive handbell community in the Twin Cities and beyond. The group is one of only three active handbell ensembles in the nation focused on LGBTQIA+ inclusivity. Ring Out will be directed by Holy Trinity's own Logan Olson. Over 20 ringers will be auditioning for the ensemble this week!

I see a strong potential for handbells to unite people in an increasingly divided and individualistic world. Throughout their history, handbell ensembles have largely been housed in churches due to their association with worship traditions and their prohibitive costs for schools or other organizations. While handbells have proven to be a beloved addition to worship services, this history has kept them out of reach for those who may not feel welcome in church settings. My hope is that Ring Out and other community ensembles will open the doors for more people to experience and fall in love with the art of handbell ringing.

Whether you ring in one of these ensembles or simply enjoy hearing the bells, there's a lot to look forward to this year!

## September 15 "Report back from Rabbis for Ceasefire delegation to Palestine"

Sharon Jaffe, is a local Kohenet - Jewish ritual leader in the earth-based and feminist traditions. She joined a multi-faith delegation to Palestine-Israel organized by Rabbis for Ceasefire and Christians for Ceasefire. Buddhists, Muslims, Hindi, and Sheik people were also participants. The delegation planned to learn about and visit Palestinian practitioners of popular resistance based in Gandhi's satyagraha. Sabeel, a Christian Palestinian organization, organized meetings and peaceful presence inside the 1948 boundaries and also in the West Bank. This report back will share what Sharon witnessed, current information on the settlers' violent incursions on Palestinian villages and responses to that, and thoughts about solidarity from an American Jewish perspective. The delegation is traveling from August 25th to September 7th. Don't miss this eye witness report on the ongoing situation in Palestine.

Thanks to a grant from the Metropolitan Regional Arts Council, the Gloria Ringers have commissioned local composer Connor Arland to write a new handbell piece highlighting aspects of LGBTQIA+ identity. The piece is part of a broader goal of expanding whose stories are told in the current catalog of published handbell music. The piece will be premiered at Holy Trinity in the spring.

The Gloria Ringers will be involved in a number of community events again this year. We're looking forward to participating in BellFest!, a day of massed ringing with 10-20 other bell ensembles in March. Ringers will bring their music into the community for our annual Christmas Carols concert at a local senior living community this December. We will end our season by collaborating with the HTLC Children's Choir to present a spring concert at Johanna Shores senior living in May.

#### SATURDAY, OCTOBER 12-OVERCOMING WHITE SUPREMACY AND PRIVILEGE


The Racial Justice committee will sponsor a workshop on October 12 on "Overcoming White Supremacy and Privilege", 9:00 a.m.-11:30 a.m. The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America has often struggled to reckon with what it means to be a 98% white church in a country full of white body supremacy. In the wake of Dylan Roof (a white supremacist ELCA church member who killed 9 people at Mother Emanuel AME Church in Charleston, SC), the stakes are high for us to figure out how to develop new cultural patterns of Gospel Inclusion. Through this engaging workshop, JUST move will provide interactive learning experiences designed to unpack how we respond to unearned white body privilege. Participants will:

- Develop a deeper understanding of white body privilege and its effects on us.
- Deepen their awareness of white supremacy cultural patterns and how to transform them into more liberative patterns.
- Increase our own awareness of our bodies and discover how to move from shared racialized trauma into healing and justice.
- Sharpen tools of breach-repairing in a white body. We will combine theoretical frameworks and practical tools along with creative pedagogical tools such as music,
- Poetry, storytelling, and conversation.
