# PASTOR DAVID'S IMMIGRATION UPDATE AND WAYS TO HELP

Dear ones.

I felt your prayers and good wishes deeply as Pastor Ingrid and I sat in the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) offices yesterday morning. Thank you from the bottom of my heart for being my community and walking this journey with me, reminding me that I am never alone.



At my interview, we received the good news that I have been approved and granted emergency permission to travel to Mexico and return to the United States. This trip is a critical piece of the jigsaw puzzle that is my immigration path. I need to travel to Mexico and come back to the United States, so this approval is a good thing. We celebrate this!

Unfortunately, this emergency travel allowance is much shorter than what we had hoped for, and this means that a series of interviews that can only happen in Mexico will need to be scheduled and completed successfully within a shortened timeframe.

Our lawyers are hopeful that this can be done, and we are working to make it happen! Holy Trinity continues to be committed to accompanying me through this process and congregational giving facilitates this. Many of you, near and far, have asked if financial giving is helpful. Yes, it is. You can feel free to donate to Holy Trinity's "Immigration Justice" Fund (https://htlcmpls.org/donate/donate-online/).

This also means that I will be leaving the U.S. this week. We hope that all will go smoothly and I can return to the U.S. with a more permanent status by Christmas, but this timing is subject to change. Holy Trinity has approved a visa acquisition leave for me during this time. I am grateful for our Council and Personnel Committee!

During this visa acquisition leave, I will be unavailable by phone and email. All questions can be directed to Pastor Ingrid and Pastor Doug. I will have one weekly Zoom call check-in with Pastor Ingrid where we will address any questions that come up. I am grateful for our pastors!

#### INDIAN BOARDING SCHOOL LEGISLATION

An important bi-partisan bill to establish a Truth and Healing Commission on Indian Boarding Schools is before Congress and needs both a hearing and a vote soon in the House of Representatives where it has strong bi-partisan support. Holy Trinity members are encouraged to contact their congressperson in the House of Representatives and urge them to support the bi-partisan Bill HR-7227 to establish a Truth and Healing Commission on Indian Boarding Schools Policy Act.

Backers of the Bill-a coalition of Indian organizations, tribes, and religious organizations—including the ELCA—hope the bill will be passed soon. The commission would be tasked with: a) conducting a comprehensive investigation of Indian boarding schools; b) holding safe, culturally appropriate public and private meetings to receive testimony; c) making recommendations to Congress based on its investigation; d) locating grave sites where deceased children in boarding schools are buried; and e) submitting a final report of findings, recommendations, and conclusions to Congress, which will be publicly available.
