EPIPHANY

"They were all together in one place." -Acts 2:1b

Sometimes we think of epiphany as something we experience alone–in a moment of solitude, we have a striking realization. For instance, Isaac Newton is walking along, an apple falls from a tree, and, bingo, he suddenly understands that the apple and the moon are both pulled by the same gravitational force. I have had a few of these moments in life that offered clarity or direction or comfort or challenge.

These days—in the midst of all of the world's joy and heartache—I am even more drawn to the epiphanies that we realize in the context of community. Scripture is littered with these stories—the magi moving together to find the Christ child, the risen Christ appearing to the disciples, the rush of the Holy Spirit when they were all together on the day of Pentecost. The divine is often revealed when we are together.

These epiphany moments open us to powerful truths. Truths like: There is a king lying in a manger that cares nothing of domination but is hellbent on justice. Truths like: Death doesn't have the final word and even at the grave we sing our alleluias. Truths like: The Spirit's fire finds its way to each of us even when (or especially when) we think ourselves unprepared or undeserving or unworthy of its presence in our lives. It's difficult to hold these truths by ourselves; we need each other to carry the weight of them.

We will soon move to a single service each Sunday morning. This decision was driven by congregants' strong desires to strengthen community bonds, to foster opportunities to connect across generations, and to amplify our sense of unity and energy. There is a richness that emerges when we are all together in one place. Dear ones, I look forward to the epiphanies that will unfold among us this season!

The church office is closed in honor of American prophet Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. A pastor of churches in Montgomery, Alabama, and Atlanta, Georgia, his witness was taken to the streets in such other places as Birmingham, Alabama, where he was arrested and jailed while protesting against segregation. He preached nonviolence and demanded that love be returned for hate. Awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1964, he was killed by an assassin on April 4, 1968. We honor his memory and witness.
