Lent is a time of renewal, regeneration, and growth. Please join us on Wednesday evenings during Lent for the following opportunities:

- All are invited to partake in the Lenten suppers on Wednesdays from 6:00-6:50 p.m. in the Community Room. Free-will donations are accepted. Our Lenten Suppers are an opportunity for us to build beloved community.

- 1. What has happened with police reform since the murder of George Floyd
- 2. Address how the current state settlement agreement and pending federal decree mandate fits in with measures for police reform
- 3. How community voices are being heard in steps to improve police accountability.
