# Reflecting on the 5th Year Anniversary of COVID Lockdown


Dear ones.

I've been thinking a lot about the five-year anniversary of COVID lockdown. As I mentioned Sunday, I recently read an article about the grief that folks are still experiencing, whether they suffered acute trauma (e.g., the death of a loved one) or whether their loss was more ambiguous (e.g., sapped social capacity).

Many of you have heard the phrase "the body keeps the score." In a book entitled just that Bessel van der Kolk writes that "trauma is not just an event that took place sometime in the past; it is also the imprint left by that experience on mind, brain, and body. This imprint has ongoing consequences for how the human organism manages to survive in the present." As we move into the week of March when life dramatically changed in 2020, I think it's important to acknowledge that our bodies carry imprints, even now.

In Gracie Morbitzer's book <u>The Modern Saints</u>, Marie Heimann writes about Mary's identity as Our Lady, Undoer of Knots. Pope Francis has promoted this devotion during his pontificate. The devotion can be traced back to the seventeenth century in Augsburg, Germany. A couple was struggling. The priest asked Mother Mary for help. That which was tied up was unknotted—both literally and figuratively. And Mary's identity as Our Lady, Undoer of Knots became known.

COVID leaves us with many knots—heightened loneliness and skeletal social bonds, among them. Add in geopolitical upheaval, and we are left feeling confused and overwhelmed. I very much like the image that we have a mother, a companion, who sits with us and unties the most stubborn of knots in our individual and communal lives. Gently, patiently, steadily, skillfully—freeing us for lives of love, forgiveness, and joy.
