LILLY GRANT STORY TELLING PROJECT

Earlier this year, the Lilly Endowment invited charitable organizations across the U.S. to submit concept papers for its new Storytelling Initiative, which aims to identify, produce, and share stories about Christian faith and life. More than 1,100 organizations submitted proposals representing a wide spectrum of Christian traditions.

We are thrilled to share that Holy Trinity Lutheran Church (HTLC) was selected as one of just 50 organizations invited to move forward to the next phase of the process. This stage includes a planning grant of up to \$50,000 to develop a full proposal for a five-year storytelling project.

At the heart of HTLC's concept is the vision of an *ecosystem* of belonging—a diverse, intergenerational community rooted in Minneapolis' Longfellow neighborhood and sustained by deep partnerships. For more than twenty years, HTLC has shared ministry and space with the Minnesota Swahili Christian Congregation, as well as with Metro Work Center (serving adults with developmental disabilities) and Soup for You (a daily, community-centered soup kitchen). Together, these groups form a vibrant hub that challenges the national narrative of the church as dying, disconnected, or irrelevant. HTLC and its partners are well-positioned to lift up honest and hopeful stories of resilience, faith, and community.

Over the next two months, Holy Trinity staff and leaders, as well as leaders from our building partners and wider community, will be developing a plan to put together a strong storytelling proposal that is consistent with the ministry we already do. This plan includes conversations with congregants. The proposal would explain how the congregation and our building partners would seek to build skills and capacity for telling our story in new and effective ways. In order to meet our deadline with the Lilly Endowment, Bob Hulteen's position has morphed from a Spark position into project management of the proposal writing.

We are asking congregants to stay after the worship service on Sunday, June 8, for lunch and a community conversation. We will provide some prompts for table conversation and feedback loops. We will aim to be done by 1:00 p.m. Please consider holding the time in your calendar for this important discussion. 
