## Survey About the New Sunday Schedule

Earlier this year Holy Trinity made the move from two Sunday morning services to a single service at 10am. The shift was prompted by lower in-person attendance—as many people worship online post-COVID—as well as hope that a single weekly service would provide more opportunity for fellowship and community building. Total weekly attendance, both in-person and online, has increased since the change, and church leadership recently surveyed the congregation to gain a deeper understanding of people's views about the new schedule.

Ninety-six Holy Trinity members responded to the survey. About three quarters previously attended the late service most Sundays, either in person or online, and one quarter attended the early service. The vast majority were regular churchgoers, attending either weekly (34%) or several times a month (45%).

The shift to a single Sunday service is widely viewed as a positive change, with 75% of respondents believing that it builds a stronger sense of community and nearly all others reporting no change in community feeling. Several people stated that the larger attendance at a combined service makes the church more vibrant, and congregants appreciate increased opportunities to connect with others. Following a very well-attended Easter service, survey respondents mentioned that full pews and the availability of convenient parking for special services may present challenges.

Eighty-nine percent of respondents reported that they like having the service begin at 10am, although some would prefer a later (7%) or earlier (4%) service. Most commenters report that the new start time works well with their Sunday schedules, and few expect the time change to have an impact on their attendance. Several people noted a need for further conversation about the timing and structure of Holy Trinity's education hour—a conversation that is ongoing for all age groups.

The pastors and church council appreciate the congregation's responses and thoughtful comments about the new schedule. Based on the survey results, increased attendance, and informal conversations with members of the congregation, the new Sunday schedule will continue. We will also seek opportunities to address some of the questions identified by the survey. Community is always evolving!
