We arrived at our destination after almost twelve hours of travel – airport delays, luggage delays, and a two-hour drive from the Charlotte airport to our destination just outside Asheville. We were (and continue to be!) beyond grateful that Sue and Bill Roberts generously opened their house for us to use as our home base during our week in the area. It was wonderful to arrive to a place that felt homey – sloppy joe meat in the fridge, snacks for us to munch on, and comfortable beds.

After having gotten a good night's rest, we recognized the wisdom of the parents who had helped to shape this trip, especially Nicki Hines and Andrea Hansen. They gifted us almost two free days before our service component would get started. 

And they dug trenches for future water diversion. I beamed with pride in knowing that our youth had earned deep respect from their peers and local leaders. I hope you will all think about asking them about their experiences whenever you see one of them. We plan on them hosting an information event later this year, so please be on the lookout for that information.

We also had a lot of fun. One evening we were able to enjoy private lake access where we swam, paddle-boarded, and some did multiple back flips. On another night we had the opportunity to putt-putt and enjoyed a grill out night with local congregations. And we also had the opportunity to enjoy a slip-and-slide courtesy of the local fire department.

Of course, all of this would not be possible without the support of our entire Holy Trinity community. To that end, I want to express deep gratitude for the ways in which you all devote time, energy, resources, and prayers on behalf of our youth. Thank you all for helping us to travel, do good work, remain connected to our community, and continue to figure out how each of us is called to be a follower of Jesus.
