HTLC Children, Youth, and Family Faith Formation August 2025 Update

Following the stirring of the Spirit, we are excited to launch into a new year of faith formation at Holy Trinity! Last summer, Andrea Hansen and Dinkenesh Coltvet, our Children, Youth, and Family Spark positions, did great work setting us up for a year of meaningful faith formation.

Building on this foundation, this year's Spark position, Anna Helgen, helped us bring further clarity to the challenges of our current Sunday School model and helped us dream about a new structure that better supports teachers and allows for flexible teacher scheduling, honors differing family rhythms and experiences, and continues to nurture and strengthen faith in children, families, and the congregation.

Over the summer, Anna met one-on-one with pastors, music staff, teachers, some parents/caring adults, and some children and very quickly common themes emerged. We have shared hopes that children will experience this congregation (and Sunday School in particular) as a place of welcome and belonging, where they can ask questions and be themselves, where they will grow in relationship with peers and be nurtured in community. Caring adults in the congregation hope that children will engage with Bible stories, learn spiritual practices, and develop a faith that engages the world. There is a desire from both teachers and parents for more intergenerational events, further opportunities for service, and continued engagement with social justice. Children hope to have more movement in the gym (and more donuts!).

With input from all these groups, we are excited to share about the Spirit's work among us as we begin a new year of forming faith in community. Beginning this fall on Sunday mornings, we'll begin at 8:30am with breakfast and open gym time. Sunday School and Confirmation start at 9:00am in the gym with a large group opening, followed (most Sundays) with breakouts into classrooms (Trinity Village in the second-floor education suite and Confirmation in the

fourth-floor Sky Room). Godly Play will continue to begin at 9:00am in the second-floor education suite as has been our

MOMENTS OF LEARNING, JOY, GRATITUDE

Just after midnight on April $16^{\rm th}$ of 2024 a fire broke out in our attic just above where we were sleeping. Squirrels had chewed on wires causing a short that smoldered and then burst into flames. We heard, smelled, and saw nothing until firefighters pounded on our door to get us out. No smoke alarms went off. Another five minutes and flame would have fallen on top of us.

Since then, we've seen and learned a lot. Grace was present with the neighbor boy who was out late, saw the flames and called 911 saving our lives. Skill and speed were demonstrated by firefighters (in 7 trucks!) who extinguished the scorching flames with gallons of water. Encouraging words and meals sustained us from friends, family and fellow congregants from Holy Trinity. We learned the pros and cons of having a landlord in our temporary apartment (we could call but would he answer?). Out of necessity we found strength to manage feelings of disorientation, grief over losses and deep frustration when insurance challenged benefits clearly covered by our policy.

Abundant care and concern have come our way and we are acutely aware of our privilege. Many people in our country and abroad are forced from their homes with few resources and little hope of returning. We are grateful for our many blessings. Displaced people are in our prayers.

From standing in the street in our pajamas watching flames shoot from our roof to walking in the front door of a home that will again be ours we've come a long way. That brings great joy and gratitude.
