#### HANDBELLS RETURN TO HOLY TRINITY

As the summer months draw to a close, it's time to return to the familiar rhythms of music ensembles at Holy Trinity. This year, we will again be offering Gloria Ringers (an ensemble for adult ringers), and Jubilation Ringers (an ensemble for middle and high school ringers).

Handbell ringing is a hands-on and collaborative musical experience. Our ensembles build strong bonds of community as we work together to learn pieces and perform them with attention to musicality. Often, this process involves problem solving, teamwork, and lots of laughter!

If you're looking to make new friendships and contribute to community life at Holy Trinity in a new way, I encourage you to give ringing a try. Some experience reading sheet music is generally beneficial, however prior handbell experience is not required. If a full year commitment isn't in the cards but you're curious about handbell ringing, keep an eye out for pop-up ringing events targeted at new ringers.

As we look forward to the second year of Jubilation Ringers, we are eager to gain more members. While ringing with any number is certainly fun, the possibilities grow with each additional set of hands. Jubilation rehearsals are collaborative and fun as we learn the fundamentals of handbell ringing and performance. The ensemble rehearses on Wednesday evenings from 6:45-7:25 p.m. This year, Jubilation will ring in worship services, join in the Handbell Christmas Concert at Becketwood Senior Living, and collaborate with Gloria Ringers and the HTLC Children's Choir for a concert at Johanna Shores Senior Living. Talk to Logan if there are any middle- or high school-aged youth in your life who might be interested!

Gloria Ringers rehearses on Wednesdays from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. The ensemble will again be participating in off-site events including the Becketwood and Johanna Shores concerts as well as BellFest, a massed ringing event which will be conducted by prominent composer Matthew Compton. We are excited to partner with the handbell choir from Mount Calvary Lutheran in Excelsior, directed by Alexis Olson (Logan's sister). Both groups will perform together for a Sunday in Excelsior in early March and at Holy Trinity on Palm Sunday. # CHILDREN'S CHOIR, JUBILATION, GLORIA RINGERS, AND CANTATE REHEARSALS RESUME THIS WEEK

Children's Choir (5:45-6:45 p.m.) is open to kids entering kindergarten through 5th grade and rehearse most weeks during the school year and sings in worship every 4-5 weeks. Children's choir rehearsals focus on basic music and singing skills as well as the importance of being leaders during worship. Jubilation (5:45-6:30 p.m.) is open to children entering 6th through 12th grade who want to learn and play handbells. Jubilation rehearses most weeks during the school year and plays in worship 4-5 times per year. Gloria Ringers (6:30-8:00 p.m.) is the adult handbell ensemble and rehearses weekly during the school year and plays in worship every 6-7 weeks. Cantate (6:45-7:30 p.m.) is a choir open to children entering 6th through 12th grade and sing in worship every 6-7 weeks. ### EXCERPT FROM A MESSAGE SENT BY MINNEAPOLIS AREA SYNOD BISHOP JEN NAGEL

In a country where gun violence is the leading cause of death for children, we must lament, grieve, and condemn, but also work together to change this reality. The ELCA's Social Message "Gun-related Violence" reminds us that "Persisting violence erodes social capital, impairs social networks, and breeds hopelessness..." In Minneapolis, we are holding the trauma of multiple days of gun violence as a community, as yet another mass shooter killed one person and wounded six in front of Cristo Rey High School. As people of faith, we are called to "peacemaking towards a vast reduction of gunrelated violence" through advocacy, community building, and healing. The pervasiveness of gun violence in the U.S. is not a reality we should accept.

His Manitoban realism emphasizes the "on earth" part of "as in heaven" for people tempted to think the other way around. Wirzba gives pragmatic suggestions that renew a deeper connection to dirt.

Alex grew up on a farm in Northwest Iowa and now works for the Minnesota Department of Agriculture. Bob was born on a farm near Bemidji and was radicalized by agrarian movements in North Dakota, where he grew up.
