RENEWAL SUNDAY SEPTEMBER 7

I am very excited for this coming Sunday! On September 7 we will be celebrating Renewal Sunday as we kick off our education programming year. We invite you all to prioritize joining us for what promises us to be a wonderfully connecting day.

From 8:30 to 9:00 a.m.: Meander your way downstairs to the gym lunchroom area. You will be met with a friendly crew that will have hot coffee, breakfast items for all ages, and an open gym for anyone needing to get wiggles out (that includes all ages, too!). A note for adult guardians: please do not drop off children but rather stick around with everyone until 9:00 a.m. There will not be any staff adult supervision of the gym area.

From 9:00 to 9:50 a.m.: Adults interested in getting a glimpse of what the next few weeks, months, and years may look like for our faith community are encouraged to make their way to the library for an Adult Forum led by Pastor Ingrid. At this same time, Godly Play-aged children (ages 4 through Kindergarten) are to meet Ms. Kay Buzza in the Godly Play room on the Second Floor Education Suite. Don't worry, we will have signage! All Sunday School and Confirmation students (grades 1-9) will remain in the gym area for an opening time together led by Pastor David. They will then break off into three classroom groups each led by at least two adults: Trinity Village 1 (grades 1-3a), Trinity Village 2 (grades 3b-5), and Confirmation (grades 6-9). Adult Education and Youth Education last until 9:50 a.m.

From 10:00 to 11:00 a.m. (unless Pastor Doug's sermon goes way over time): Everyone is highly encouraged to join us for worship. I am especially excited for a blessing we will share with all children, youth, and teachers who are kicking off the church programming year. I won't ruin the surprise, but everyone will get a cute gift alongside the blessing!

From 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.: All are invited to join us on the front lawn for a festive time and coffee hour. There will be a bounce house and a face painter! We will have veggie and meat tacos, sheet cake, and coffee! There will be opportunities to sign up for our upcoming programming and reconnecting with one another as we launch into the new calendar year. Confirmation students and post-confirmation youth will be helping our adult volunteers make sure that this event flows smoothly. I invite you all to connect with them and share your thanks.
