#### RISING TOGETHER

The "Rising Together" video project tells the story of how community relationships, formed in the wake of the 2020 social uprising, continue to foster healing, equitable development, and artistic expression in the Longfellow neighborhood. Through the lens of a short film and social media campaign, the project highlights the transfer of the MIGIZI parcel into BIPOC ownership, the visionary redevelopment plans of Colombian-born developer Wilmar Delgado, and the future home of Pangea World Theater—a cultural cornerstone committed to justice and community.
