Robert Lowry (1826-1899), the author and composer of “How Can I Keep from Singing?” was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He attended the University at Lewisburg (later renamed Bucknell University), where he became a professor of literature. He was ordained as a Baptist minister and pastored in Pennsylvania, New York, and New Jersey. He also worked as a music editor at the Biglow and Main Publishing Company and helped found the Sixth Avenue Baptist Church in New York City. He wrote approximately 500 gospel songs, of which “Shall We Gather at the River” is perhaps the most well-known.

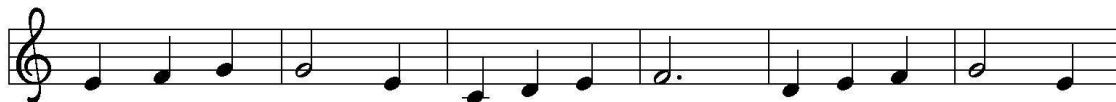
Grape juice and gluten-free wafers are available upon request to the server.

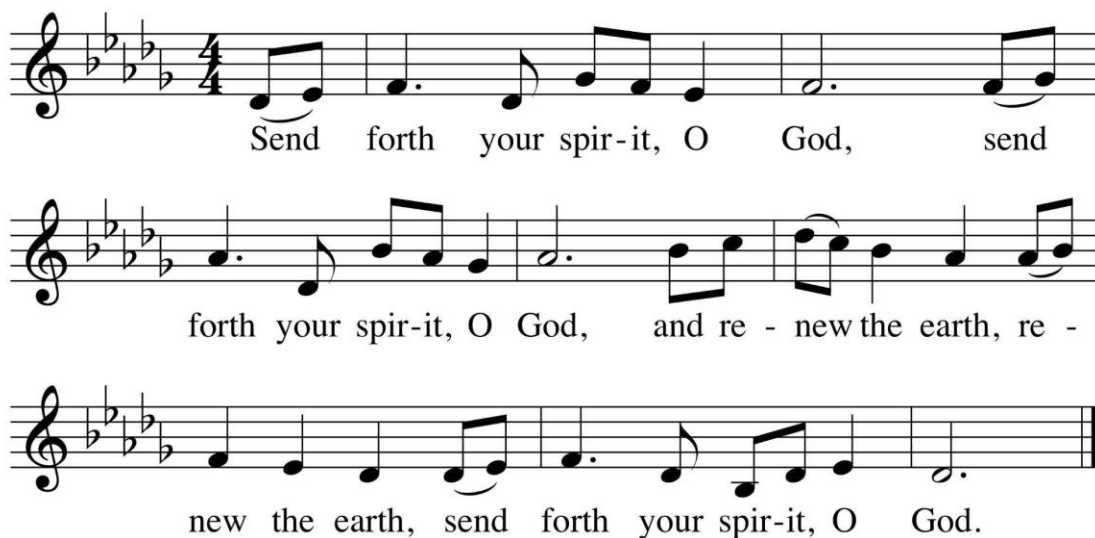

SEQUEERITY AT HOLY TRINITY

You may notice a new presence on Sunday mornings: a staff member from Sequeerity, a Minneapolis-based de-escalation team. They'll be here from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m., walking through the building and grounds. Their staff wear T-shirts that say Sequeerity, so you'll be able to recognize them easily.

Sequeerity is a team owned and operated by queer and POC women whose mission is to create and maintain safe spaces for all, especially for LGBTQIA+ and immigrant communities. They are not armed, and their focus is on relationship-building and de-escalation.
