Reflections on the Spiritual Practices Work Group

During the month of November, ten women and two facilitators engaged in a spiritual practices group that came out of requests from church members wanting to explore different ways to tap into and express their faith. Through four sessions, we learned about and then practiced: Lectio Devina, the Prayer of Examen, Walking a Labyrinth, and a Community Spiritual Practice.

Experiencing new and revisiting familiar practices enabled us to focus on what we consider our spiritual practices or routines, what we can do to refresh or add more life to our faith life, and how sharing on a deeper spiritual level is a powerful way to be connected to others and to know ourselves more fully. Comments from group participants speak to the value of this group:

"Walking the labyrinth at Como Park on a frigid and windy Sunday afternoon, I experienced the gift of slowing down my walking and of also trusting that I would not get lost, as there is no way to screw it up if you just keep putting one foot in front of the other. We shared the experience communally but in silence, which was powerful."

"I especially enjoyed the exercise of Examen and sharing what came out of that. It was also very meaningful to share our faith story in pairs."

"In these times when daily news cycles keep bringing challenges to any sort of mental stability, spiritual practices gain an increasing relevance. I found the learnings powerful: it was a gift to share deeply with a small group that included strangers (to me), church acquaintances and friends for decades—on faith topics that are not usually talked about. I return from time to time to the exercise of the Prayer of Examen, where we considered matters of importance to our spirit, such as what enlivens us, where we "belong," what we do for—and how we express our love for—others, and how we understand where we are loved."

"I loved learning about the practices, getting to share our stories, and the extra treat of learning about *zines*." (One of our group members created a wonderful 'zine' about prayer.)

Everyone brought their authentic self to this group and many expressed an interest in continuing a spiritual practices group of some form in the future, so stay tuned...

BYSTANDER INTERVENTION TIPS IN MOMENTS OF CONFLICT

Can you remember a time when you witnessed conflict and were confused about how and if you should act? You see a child bullying another child at a playground. You observe racial harassment in a traffic stop. You hear a Spanish speaking neighbor and citizen confronted by ICE. Is it best to keep your distance or try to intervene? There are no easy answers. But there are some options for taking action to consider.

Many community agencies offer training on how to **be** a helpful observer in conflictual situations and, when appropriate, take action to reduce the tensions or harm that can come to a victim. You may want to attend one of these trainings, but even if you can't do that there are steps you can **take** with bystander intervention. One resource is Bystander Observation and the "Five Ds."

DATA CENTER PETITION NEEDS YOUR SUPPORT

The rapid proliferation of AI technology requires the construction of massive data centers throughout our country (and the world). What is just becoming evident is the massive drain these centers are on energy and resources. The centers already constructed are using water and electricity equivalent to a quarter of a million households! What a drain on the community and state hosting them.

Third Act Minnesota and a consortium of climate and environmental groups want the state legislature to enact legislation requiring a thorough Environmental Impact Report before centers are approved in Minnesota.

We urge you to sign a petition asking for just that! And we are aiming for at least 10,000 signatures by December 20 when the petition must be submitted to the governor's office.
