Creating a place of belonging through volunteering

Like most of us, I have been feeling the heaviness of what is happening in our country, our communities, and to our neighbors. It can be a challenge at times to reflect on 2025 and pull out moments of goodness. But those moments are there and I find many of them within this congregation.

Often when asked about working at Holy Trinity, I use the phrase, "you never know what's going to happen," and that part it true. But I also know what IS going to happen. We are going to support our neighbors. We are going to stand up to injustices. We are going to welcome members, friends, neighbors, and strangers into this space. We are going to offer them comfort, a space to feel seen, valued, and respected. Together we are going to build community and create a place of belonging.

The work of creating belonging is not only that of the pastors and staff, it is the work of all of us. It is through our members and volunteers that we can create a welcoming environment that focuses on acceptance and connection. That is particularly important on Sundays. The role of our worship volunteers is vital. It is through those that help with altar guild, greeting, ushering, serving communion, offering coffee and treats, livestreaming, leading worship through readings and prayer that we can create a place of belonging. Sure, the pastors are important, but it is our volunteers that are the lifeblood of our church. Imagine being the one to welcome a visitor in that may be searching for meaning or serving communion to someone exploring their faith or offering treats to someone hoping to feel at home. I love imagining those possibilities and how the opportunities on Sunday morning can help create space for belonging as well as giving volunteers a sense of purpose.

I invite you to explore Sunday morning volunteer opportunities. Over the next several weeks, we will have sign up sheets in the Community Room. You can also call the office or email me if you are interested in learning more about opportunities. You can volunteer in ways that fit your schedule, your personality, your sense of purpose. You can sign up to help with something once a year, once a month, once a quarter, whatever works for you. If you have a spouse or friend you'd like to team up with, let me know, we can make sure you are scheduled together. Volunteering as a family is great too, especially for greeting/ushering or serving coffee and treats.




