## MUSICIAN SEARCH UPDATE

Worship is at the heart of the Holy Trinity community. We value our time together for celebration, renewal, reflection, and strength. Music plays a dynamic role in those experiences. It can unify, challenge, or comfort. We have been blessed to have talented and sensitive musicians, and our congregation is in the midst of a search for new leadership.

From the pews we experience the end product of our staff's creative work. Staff members meet months in advance to choose hymns and anthems that highlight themes in the selected scriptures of the day. They spend hours each week rehearsing with the adult choir, Trinity Singers, and guest musicians. They organize and coordinate information for the bulletin. They even maintain the sheet music library, instruments, and choir robes. This work is informed by years of training. We are privileged to bear witness to their art, but rarely witness their careful preparation.

Our congregation began a time of discernment and transition last summer when Julie Lindorff left her position as organist, and when Rick Prescott resigned as choir director last spring, creating an additional need. Tim Buendorf has served as interim organist since last fall, and Ann Schrooten has taken on temporary additional responsibilities in addition to her usual duties with children's choirs and handbells. Presently, there are two primary roles to be filled: organist and adult choir director.

With input from those involved with music at Holy Trinity, the church council, personnel committee, and the pastoral staff have been discussing how to best fill those vacancies. A search committee was formed to recruit and select a new church musician or musicians. The committee consists of Peter Johnson, Sue Roberts, Deb Sodd, Rachel Trelstad-Porter, Nicholas Ellison, Pastor Ingrid, and Pastor Jay. This group is a blend of musical expertise and church experiences. The search committee has been given two options for how to fill the vacancies:

1. Combined organist and choir director. A position called Cantor that would be a ¾ time position.
2. Hire one person to direct the adult choirs (3/8 time) and one person to play organ (1/2 time).

The search committee will consider the skills of the candidates and decide which option maximizes the gifts of the candidates and fits the needs of the congregation. There are advantages and disadvantages to both routes, and the search committee has carefully and thoughtfully weighed the merits of each.

The search committee posted the job in early June, and received over 30 applications. The job descriptions were crafted to reflect the music and spiritual personality of the church and the collaborative and creative nature of the current staff. The interview and audition process has begun, and we have been pleased with the candidates. We have spoken to them about their knowledge of liturgy and hymnody, and we have witnessed their musicianship through hymns, solos, and psalms. Later this month we will hear them lead the choir in rehearsal.
