As another school year comes to a close, we are thankful for our ongoing partnership with Longfellow Alternative High School, a school for women who are parenting or pregnant. This year brought many meaningful opportunities for connection. Most recently, we were glad to partner with Longfellow Alternative and VocalEssence in Carnegie Hall's Lullaby Concert that featured the work of some of the school's Latina students.

I act as a support person for our ongoing partnership with Longfellow Alternative, but Zoe Martinez (the leading liaison) and many, many congregants commit time and energy to building the relationships with the students and staff. I have the fabulous opportunity to read along with what we're teaching and learning through our partnership. This past week, I received the minutes from the meeting the Longfellow Knitters held at the end of the school year to review the knitting class, which is now in its fourth semester. Several Holy Trinity members join together with neighborhood knitters to teach the class each week.

The minutes read that the Longfellow Knitters were pleased with this year's learning. They cited the following as important aspects of the class:

- The participants (of all ages) were able to learn something new.
- The students were able to complete a project (e.g., wash cloths, headbands, booties, hats, scarves).
- Students and teachers were able to help one another.
- There were weekly positive interactions between students and adults.
- Everyone involved in the class was invited to let go of perfection.

They anticipate the class this fall will be held on Thursdays. Crocheting will be added to the offerings. More information will become available over the course of the summer.

JUNE 12 "Created in the Image of God" Pastor Marchelle Hallman

One of the first things we read in Genesis is that "God created humankind in God's own image, in the image of God, God created them; male and female God created them." *Imago Dei*—that is, in the image of God—is an important concept for our faith tradition. It helps to shape our understanding of both the self and the neighbor. This concept also offers an ecumenical basis for human and environmental rights. JUNE 19 "Alexander Technique" Miriam Scholz-Carlson

Alexander Technique is a method of studying and increasing one's body awareness in order to reduce muscular tension and move more freely. It is often used by musicians and performers who encounter stress or pain in their playing, but is useful for anyone who seeks to better understand how their bodies move. In addition to performing and teaching violin, Miriam's expertise has grown from traditional Alexander methods to include a wider study of movement, muscles, and kinesthetic awareness.
