ADULT FORUM FOLLO- UP

Earlier this month, Amy Froiland-Parada led a deeply powerful forum presentation on the topic of "Supporting Survivors of Sex Trafficking in MN." Since then, we've had requests for specific needs from Breaking Free, the organization Amy works with:

—Tidying up in the garage (huge need!), to include sorting and hanging donations, helping to organize the garage; capacity for 5-7 people to help

—Grounds tidying, to include raking leaves, sweeping leaves in the back at Breaking Free's main site, cleaning up the grounds and garbage at Permanent Housing, shampooing carpets at Permanent Housing; capacity for 10+ people to help

—Providing meals for speakers bureau (Monday), meals for 5-10 women and children (a protein, a veggie, a salad, a dessert, and a powdered beverage); capacity for 3 people to help serve meal in the kitchen; meal should be completed before it comes to BF

—Arranging a donation drive for outreach packets, winter clothes, or other needed items at Breaking Free.
