## THE SANCTUARY MOVEMENT

In light of significant concerns for the safety and well-being of the approximately 90,000 Minnesotans who are threatened by deportation, Holy Trinity's Council has decided that our congregation will join the growing sanctuary movement.

At least 22 congregations in Minnesota have joined this movement, considering together how best to respond to the threat that the new administration poses to our immigrant neighbors. ISAIAH, a state-wide faith-based coalition with more than 300 member congregations, is leading this effort in Minnesota in partnership with a broader coalition of organizations specializing in immigration issues.

Many congregations will designate themselves as "sanctuary congregations"—meaning that they will create a space of refuge in their own buildings, for immigrant individuals and families who are in immediate danger of deportation and provide accompaniment for an undetermined about of time. Others will declare themselves "sanctuary-supporting congregations"—which indicates that they will work in partnership with sanctuary churches by providing both physical resources (money, food, clothing, health, or legal support) and being a public witness to the movement by hosting prayer vigils, being loud about their support of immigrant communities, and providing rapid response in situations of urgent need (press events, raids, protests, etc.).

Holy Trinity's Council has chosen to participate as a "sanctuary supporting" congregation at this time. While a small team has formed around this effort as we've been gathering information, we'll need a larger team to sustain what may well be a long-term commitment. If you're interested in joining this team, our next meeting will be on Thursday, February 23, from 6:00 to 7:30 p.m.

Be on the lookout for details about a community meeting about this, to be scheduled soon. This commitment will require agility, some comfort with ambiguity, and a fair amount of stepping out in faith, so the sanctuary team will work to keep communication open and we will welcome your questions or concerns as they arise.

This congregation's leadership feels strongly that it's time for a clear moral declaration from faith communities, and for our immigrant neighbors to know that we stand with them.

In such an uncertain time in the public square, I'm thankful for the faithful and bold spirit of this community.

My father had a health care directive. He went to his lawyer, paid for his time, and came out with a legal document that explained exactly what to do in very specific situations. It was filed with the right people and notarized properly. When he had a massive heart attack with accompanying brain damage on May 4, 2016, we consulted this health care directive for help. It provided none. It was so narrowly specific that it did not provide any help to those of us making life and death decisions for the man we loved. I want us at Holy Trinity to do better for you. I want us to partner with the area medical providers to provide a comprehensive, goal-focused health care directive that provides broad, uniform, useful direction to medical staff and families. To that end, I want to talk to you about Honoring Choices so that you live and die on your own terms. Even if you already have a health care directive or a living will there will be important information about important choices. You will find out how to get free help in creating, explaining, and recording your wishes. Chris will be available from 11:00 a.m. -3:00 p.m. to assist individuals, free of charge, with their directives.
