GREAT AND HOLY WEEK

Since Palm Sunday, our worship journey has taken us through what St. Augustine called the “Great and Holy Week.”

Unfortunately, in large measure, at least in the churches of North America, people too often make a liturgical leap from the waving of the palms to the empty tomb. So much is missed, ignored, about the passion of Christ. When we miss the awful events of Jesus’ last days in Jerusalem, we miss the Savior’s passion for God’s people and all of God’s creation. We need to hear the terrible news before we hear the good news.

As many read these lines, worshipers from our congregation are in the midst of the Triduum, the holiest three days of the liturgical calendar. Through the “one service of three days,” we begin at dusk on Holy Thursday, remembering the birth of the Eucharist. In the humbling act of foot-washing, we hear and practice Jesus’ *mandatum* (mandate) commanding his disciples to love one another. On Good Friday we mingle our contemporary laments with Jesus’ love and mercy for all people of all time. Then, on Saturday, we gather in Vigil to recall the salvation history of God’s people.

As we journey through the events of his last days, remembering the cruel and unjust humiliation and execution of Jesus, we are powerfully reminded that there is no human condition, no human suffering, that does not affect the very heart of God. In our birthing, living, and dying, God is one with us, even in the bleak mess of the world and the brokenness of our lives.

But, then. Come Sunday, we gather to celebrate the good news of the greatest moment in human history. Join us in hearing and sharing the good news: Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.
