## SUNDAY BREAD DELIVERIES

Trinity Lutheran Church of Minnehaha Falls, located on the corner of 52nd Street and 41st Avenue South, picks up bread donations from Breadsmith on Grand Avenue each Saturday evening. Breadsmith donates all of the loaves they did not sell that day. The congregation then brings the loaves to the church and gives bread to all who come to worship on Sunday morning.

That congregation consumes a lot of bread, but cannot eat all of the bread they are given! Several months ago, Trinity of Minnehaha Falls invited our congregation to pick up the bread that is left over after all of their members have taken their fill. There are usually two or three large garbage bags of bread for us to take. Zoe Martinez has been coordinating people to go two-by-two to Trinity of Minnehaha Falls on Sundays at noon to pick up what remains. These teams then deliver the bread to the residents of Trinity Apartments, the apartment adjacent to Holy Trinity's building. The residents at Trinity Apartments are very appreciative of these donations. Particularly for those living on fixed incomes, this bread is a real gift.

We'd love to expand our network of volunteers who are occasionally willing to do the pick-up and delivery immediately following our 11:00 service. There is a sign-up on the table in the Community Room. Please consider helping out with this project. It usually takes about 30 minutes.
