Last summer's seasonal calendar began with the words, "Can you hear the jackhammers echoing? The renovation construction is well underway at Holy Trinity." We are delighted to report that just eleven months later, the renovation of the east entrance and office space is complete (save a few minor things we're adjusting to suit our needs). From our perspective, the project has exceeded our stated hopes in the areas of accessibility, hospitality, and safety. Thank you for making a dream become reality!

As the jackhammers came to a rest, Pastor Jay Carlson announced his resignation and members of our congregational Transition Team (Cathy Alpizar, Josh Becker, Pastor Mark Holman, Sara Jensen, Tom Kleven, Theresa Rian, and Deb Sodt) began taking important initial steps in the process for our congregation's calling a new Lead Pastor. This team's major task this summer is preparing the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America's Ministry Site Profile (MSP), a document that articulates our congregation's history, identity, mission, values, and goals. Further, the MSP will identify the personal characteristics, skills, experiences, and passions we value in a Lead Pastor.

Over the next several weeks, the Transition Team will offer opportunities for all members to be involved in the preparation of this document. And please pray for members of the Transition Team as they, along with the Church Council, provide leadership in the Spirit-led process of discernment and planning.

You will soon receive the summer calendar in your mailboxes, which offers information about Music in the Garden, Sunday pop-up choirs, adult forums, summer trips, children's camps, congregational picnics, and much, much more. Come and hear from this year's Wellstone House Lutheran Volunteer Corps (LVC) volunteers. LVC is a faith-based, full-time service and leadership program operating in 13 cities across the United States. LVC's mission is to unite people to work for peace with justice. They do this by placing volunteers in full-time positions at social justice organizations for one year. LVC volunteers come from a wide variety of faith backgrounds, and do not need to be Lutheran. All volunteers live together in community and practice simple and sustainable living. LVC volunteers receive a modest stipend which covers housing, food, transportation, health insurance, and personal expenses.
