One of Pastor Jay Carlson's recommendations when he left Holy Trinity was that the Council, in cooperation with the Personnel Committee, create a Parental Leave Policy. (Previously, the congregation had no such policy.) Over the past nine months, leadership has been hard at work responding to this suggestion, and I'm pleased to say the Council recently approved a policy that states that "upon the birth or adoption of a child, clergy and permanent employees with at least 12 months of service are eligible for up to 12 weeks of parental leave within a 12-month period. Up to 8 weeks may be paid leave, and up to an additional 4 weeks may be unpaid leave."

This policy allows me to lean into a new vocation after the birth of our child. The due date is August 22. I plan to work up until the point of delivery, so as to ease the transition for Interim Lead Pastor Hans Lee, who begins August 7. I will then be on parental leave until our annual symposium on November 10-11. Should the baby come early or late, I will work with congregational leadership and colleagues to adjust this tentative schedule. While you won't see me in the office or in worship during this time, I'll be available to field any questions that Pastor Hans may have about ministry at Holy Trinity.

I am currently working to ensure that all of my ministry responsibilities are well covered while I am away. This includes everything from Community Church articles to the prayers of the people, the fall retreat to First Fridays with Friends, adult forums to racial justice small groups. I'm grateful for the congregants and staff members who are stepping up to offer leadership in various ways. Also, while I am away, we have scheduled guest worship leaders, who will assist Pastor Hans with the preaching task. I hope that you will be richly blessed by their presence at Holy Trinity. Frankly, I'm sorry to miss the opportunity to hear their voices!

Sunday, September 24—Guest Preacher, Barbara Lundblad

Rev. Dr. Barbara Lundblad is an ordained minister of the ELCA. She served 16 years as a parish pastor in New York City, as well as campus pastor at Lehman College and New York University. She has taught preaching at Yale Divinity School, Princeton Theological Seminary, Hebrew Union College, and in the D.Min. program of the Association of Chicago Theological Schools. Recently retired, Lundblad is the Joe R. Engle Professor Emeritus of Preaching at Union Theological Seminary in New York City, N. Y. She now lives in the Twin Cities Metro Area.

Sunday, October 8—Guest Preacher, Keith Olstad

Keith Ölstad, a retired pastor, is a member of this congregation. Church in Duluth, becoming the first woman to be appointed a pastor from the A.M.E. church in the state of Minnesota. She has served as a chaplain for the Minnesota Department of Corrections since 1995. We've been blessed by her preaching and her teaching at Holy Trinity over the past few years and are delighted that she is willing to return!
